

Stormwater Engineer, Township of Upper Dublin

The Township of Upper Dublin invites qualified and experienced Commonwealth of Pennsylvania registered professional engineers to submit proposals to provide program management services for the Township's neighborhood stormwater management improvement program. This program is anticipated to include various stormwater management projects with an approximate total all in project cost three million dollars. An individual with a thorough knowledge of the theory, principles and practices of engineering as applied to stormwater management and public works projects is required. The engineer should have a thorough knowledge of state of the art engineering and planning methods, best management practices, state/federal regulations, and techniques as applied to the design and funding of municipal separate storm sewer systems and drainage projects. The engineer must be competent to perform engineering computations and to recommend least cost methods to solve stormwater management problems within various parts of the Township. The Township anticipates that the engineer will be involved in identifying sources of stormwater management funding and therefore, grant writing and proposal experience is highly desired. Further, the engineer must have the ability to meet and deal effectively with the public and to establish and maintain an effective working relationship with Township officials and employees, Township professional consultants, government regulatory agencies, non-governmental organizations, and members of the general public.

Minimum requirements are those associated with a registered professional engineer, valid driver's license with acceptable driving record, and a minimum of four years, post registration related experience. The engineer must organize, communicate and present complex ideas clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing. Further, the engineer must manage small and modest size drainage and stormwater management projects through all phases of development including concept, design, permitting, construction specifications, competitive bidding (prevailing wage), construction, and maintenance. The engineer will serve as an independent engineering consultant to the Township for an expected term of eighteen months. The required work schedule and effort is estimate to be thirty hours per week. However, compensation and level of effort for this assignment are subject to negotiation, and will be considered on a per day or contract basis with flexible work hours. The Township will make reasonable accommodations to provide office space and administrative resources.
