

Upper Dublin Township Recycling NEWS!

Residents of Upper Dublin Township may now recycle plastics with code #1 through #7, commonly referred to as Single Stream Recycling. Re-Community Recycling processes all residential recyclables collected in our recycling stream and can now accommodate plastics #1 through #7 recycling. Residents can recycle without having to check for the correct plastic code on the recyclable product. Keep in mind to keep the recycling stream clean by rinsing food residue off of recyclables. ***Plastic bags, PVC plastic and Styrofoam (including packing peanuts) are NOT accepted in our recycling stream.***

The following is a guide for the common types of plastics purchased by consumers:

Code	Type	Description
# 1	PET or PETE	Polyethylene Terephthalate (easy for <i>you</i> to say), used most often for soda bottles.
# 2	HDPE	High Density Polyethylene, used for milk jugs, detergent containers, shampoo bottles, etc.
# 3	V	Vinyl or Polyvinyl Chloride, rigid plastic containers often used for cleaning product containers.
# 4	LDPE	Low Density Polyethylene, used for plastic tubs and lids, such as butter and margarine tubs.
# 5	PP	Polypropylene, used for yogurt and butter containers.
# 6	PS	Polystyrene, used for food storage and serving products.
# 7	Other	Other mixed plastics.
